
Message from the Family Justice Center




2022 was the year of reconnection. Our community programs went back in person, resulting in heartwarming moments and many hugs. In November, we hosted a violence prevention conference, Mission Possible, attended by 90 individuals in person and over 70 on-line. Our partnership stayed steady and strong, and we continued to work with 60+ partners. Another remarkable achievement was the expansion of our mental health services - we provided free mental health services to 366 adults and 100 children, with no requirements for insurance or paperwork. In addition to mental health services, we began our pilot free telehealth services, TeleCare, which will grow and reach more people in 2023.

 14% have no medical insurance
 12% live with a substance abuser
